




Chelsea Flower Show

We have supplied many gardens at Chelsea Flower Show over the years, directly or indirectly through other nurseries stocking our trees. This year however was different, as we were the principal supplier for Darren Hawkes (Landscapes), who designed one of the main avenue gardens for the Samaritans Charity.

Darren used a mixture of our trees and trees sourced from Europe. It all started back in 2021 when Darren and Philip took a trip to Europe to find the perfect trees for the Chelsea garden. Their search took them to nurseries all over Holland, Belgium and Germany but they finally settled on the inimitable Solitair Nursery in Belgium. Four trees were chosen and delivered to our nursery in ?? 2021 where they were containerised ready for Chelsea the following year.

We are very proud of the Silver Gilt Darren was awarded for his Samaritan Garden.



Wilding Field

Apart from growing approximately 11,000 multi-stem trees, we have made the decision to leave a 12-acre field to revert to nature. This field contains a slope and a pond, and seemed like the perfect place for mother nature to do her thing. We are in our second year of relaxing the land (as Dan Pearson put it recently) and it is very rewarding to see how quickly birds and insects are flourishing.

Our new Production Manager, Ross Upton, has a special interest in ecology and he is carrying out bat & insect surveys to collect data to monitor how these populations are changing. We will release further information in the months and years to come.

We are also introducing a number of tree varieties from the Caucasus region, which lies between the Black Sea and Caspian Sea. We have chosen trees from the Caucasus as this area has been identified as having a climate which is thought to be similar to the predicted UK climate in the years to come.

Acer campestre
Field Maple

Flowers:	Small, greenish-yellow corymbs.
Fruit:	Typical wing-shaped seeds.
Bark:	Very unusual, almost cork like.
Leaves:	Deciduous, five lobed, dark green.
Autumn Colour:	Bright yellow.
Ultimate Height:	14m
Uses:	Very easy tree to grow, makes a very good shade tree with very neat canopy.



Acer cappadocicum 'Aureum'
Golden Cappadocicum Maple

Flowers:	Small, yellow-green corymbs.
Fruit:	Typical wing shaped seeds.
Bark:	Smooth to slightly fissured.
Leaves:	Deciduous, five lobed, clean-cut, palmate leaves which start purple then bright yellow followed by pale green.
Autumn Colour:	Bright yellow.
Ultimate Height:	16m
Uses:	Medium sized tree with a rounded canopy and very distinctive yellow spring foliage.



Acer cappadocicum ‘Rubrum’
Red Cappadocicum Maple

Flowers:	Small, yellow-green corymbs.
Fruit:	Typical wing-shaped seeds.
Bark:	Smooth to slightly fissured.
Leaves:	Deciduous, five lobed, clean-cut, palmate leaves. New growth is bright red.
Autumn Colour:	Golden yellow.
Ultimate Height:	18m
Uses:	Very tolerant, medium sized tree with a rounded canopy and very attractive new red growth in early summer. Great for gardens and parks.



Acer x freemanii ‘Autumn Blaze’
Freeman Maple

Flowers:	Reddish flower corymbs.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth silvery grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, five lobed, bright green with slightly silvery undersides.
Autumn Colour:	Bright orange and red.
Ultimate Height:	14m
Uses:	Large and tolerant of most conditions, this tree is great in big gardens and parks. Very attractive autumn colour.



Acer ginnala Amur Maple

Flowers:	Greenish white umbels in late spring.
Fruit:	Bright red wing-shaped seeds.
Bark:	Smooth grey bark.
Leaves:	Deciduous, three lobed, the middle lobe being longer than the outer two. Fresh green in colour.
Autumn Colour:	Bright orange to red.
Ultimate Height:	6m
Uses:	Umbrella shaped crown with bright red seeds in summer. They are able to cope with harsh conditions such as strong winds and poor soil. Their autumn display is quite spectacular.



Acer griseum Paperbark Maple

Flowers:	Greenish white umbels in May.
Fruit:	Red fruits in summer, browning with age.
Bark:	Red peeling bark - very attractive.
Leaves:	Deciduous, three lobed with the middle lobe significantly longer. Shiny dark green.
Autumn Colour:	Bright orange to red.
Ultimate Height:	8m
Uses:	<i>Acer griseum</i> makes a beautiful specimen tree with unusual red peeling bark, especially in winter with the sun behind it.



Alnus cordata Italian Alder

Flowers:	Yellow catkins early spring.
Fruit:	Small woody cones.
Bark:	Smooth grey when young and vertical cracks with age.
Leaves:	Deciduous, glossy green, heart shaped.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	Up to 20m
Uses:	Good for screening as they keep their leaves very late into autumn/early winter.



Amelanchier x lamarckii June Berry or Snowy Mespilus

Flowers:	Beautiful, pure white flowers together with new coppery leaves.
Fruit:	Edible berries in June, very much like blueberries in appearance, first red in colour, turning to purple.
Bark:	Smooth, grey light/brown.
Leaves:	Deciduous, elliptical leaves turning from coppery red to dark green.
Autumn Colour:	Incredible display of reds and oranges.
Ultimate Height:	8m
Uses:	A perfect small tree for a small garden or courtyard with flower, berry and autumn display.



Arbutus unedo Strawberry Tree

Flowers:	Small, white bell shaped, loved by bees.
Fruit:	Red, round, slightly spiky fruit which resemble a strawberry.
Bark:	Reddish brown fissured with age. Bright red new growth tips.
Leaves:	Evergreen, dark green and glossy. Broad with serrated edges.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	6-10m
Uses:	Small evergreen tree with pretty white flowers and attractive fruits - loved by bees and birds.



Arbutus unedo f. rubra Pink Strawberry Tree

Flowers:	Small, pink rounded flowers that appear alongside the fruit.
Fruit:	Redish pink, small strawberry like fruit.
Bark:	Grey and fissured with bright red new growth.
Leaves:	Evergreen, dark green and glossy. Broad with serrated edges.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	6-10m
Uses:	Small evergreen tree with pretty pink flowers and attractive fruits - loved by bees and birds.



Betula albosinensis ‘Fascination’
White Chinese Birch

Flowers:	Yellow catkins.
Fruit:	Inconspicuous.
Bark:	Smooth bark with outstanding colours – creamy white to pinkish to coppery-orange.
Leaves:	Deciduous, ovoid or elliptical. Slightly pointed, light green becoming darker green in summer.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow to yellow-orange.
Ultimate Height:	6-8m
Uses:	Smallest of the Birch trees we grow. Great for small spaces with beautiful peeling bark in the winter.



Betula ermanii
Erman’s Birch

Flowers:	Green-yellow catkins.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	White to yellowish-cream coloured - peeling.
Leaves:	Deciduous, ovate green leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Bright yellow.
Ultimate Height:	16m
Uses:	Gold yellow peeling bark and bright yellow autumn colour. There is some variation in bark colour and size between individual trees.



Betula nigra
River Birch

Flowers:	Yellow catkins.
Fruit:	Inconspicuous.
Bark:	Young stems are black (<i>nigra</i>). Older bark cinnamon-brown, peeling in curly strips.
Leaves:	Deciduous, diamond shaped, dull green early in season, later shiny green with velvety hairs.
Autumn Colour:	Pale yellow.
Ultimate Height:	15m
Uses:	Bark creates winter interest and as a specimen canopy tree in the middle of the lawn.



Betula nigra ‘Heritage’
River Birch ‘Heritage’

Flowers:	Yellow catkins.
Fruit:	Inconspicuous.
Bark:	Young stems black (<i>nigra</i>). Older bark cinnamon-brown, peeling in curly strips.
Leaves:	Deciduous, diamond shaped, dull green early in the season, later shiny green with velvety hairs.
Autumn Colour:	Pale yellow.
Ultimate Height:	12m
Uses:	More upright version of <i>Betula nigra</i> with beautiful peeling bark and great canopy.



Betula pendula
Silver Birch

Flowers:	Yellow catkins.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	White, with dark fissured cracks at the base with age.
Leaves:	Deciduous, small triangular toothed leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow.
Ultimate Height:	15-20m
Uses:	Tall native tree with a light canopy that will bring height and grace into any garden space and the white bark is an extra bonus during the dark winter months.



Betula utilis ‘Grayswood Ghost’
Himalayan Birch

Flowers:	Yellow catkins.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	White and grey. Lighter underneath.
Leaves:	Deciduous, small ovate toothed leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow.
Ultimate Height:	16m
Uses:	Tall tree with white stems and grey peeling bark.




Betula utilis 'Jacquemontii'
Himalayan Birch

Flowers:	Yellowish catkins 15 cm long.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Pure white, especially after peeling off.
Leaves:	Deciduous, dark green, larger than normal birch leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow.
Ultimate Height:	20m
Uses:	Tall tree with bright pure white stems (especially during the winter months).



Buxus sempervirens 'Rotundifolia'
Box Rotundifolia

Flowers:	Clusters of very small, pale yellow flowers.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth light grey.
Leaves:	Evergreen, larger green leaves than the <i>Buxus semperivens</i> which darken in winter.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	6-8m
Uses:	As a small, evergreen tree with characterful stems.



Carpinus betulus
Hornbeam

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth light grey that can have some characterful twists.
Leaves:	Deciduous, leaves like Beech with more ridged veins.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow-orange turning brown, often remaining on the tree until spring.
Ultimate Height:	20m
Uses:	Very robust. Makes a beautiful umbrella shaped multi-stemmed tree, especially when pruned regularly, and this ensures that the leaves are retained during the winter months.



Carpinus betulus ‘Fastigiata’
Fastigate Hornbeam

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth, grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, elliptical fresh green leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow-brown.
Ultimate Height:	20m
Uses:	Very strong shape. Can be used as a focal point or with two as a symmetrical entrance.



Carpinus betulus ‘Frans Fontaine’
Fastigiate Hornbeam

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth, grey bark.
Leaves:	Deciduous, elliptical fresh green.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow-brown.
Ultimate Height:	12m
Uses:	Upright and naturally more narrow than Carpinus betulus ‘Fastigiata’. Great for avenues or a focal point.



Clerodendrum trichotomum
Harlequin Glorybower

Flowers:	Fragrant small white flowers with a red calyx.
Fruit:	White drupes which turn bright electric blue as they ripen.
Bark:	Textured grey bark.
Leaves:	Deciduous, large ovate which are soft and downy with a strong odour when crushed.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	6m
Uses:	Small, umbrella shaped tree with very fragrant flowers later in the summer and show-stopping fruit.



Cornus controversa
Giant Dogwood

Flowers:	Creamy, white flattened cymes up to 18cm across.
Fruit:	Blue-black berries.
Bark:	Smooth.
Leaves:	Deciduous, ovate leaves distinctly wedge-shaped towards the base.
Autumn Colour:	Reddish-orange.
Ultimate Height:	14m
Uses:	As a specimen tree on the lawn or as a dominant tree in a garden design where its unique layered shape can be appreciated.



Cornus kousa chinensis
Chinese Dogwood

Flowers:	Four white or pink bracts with a dark centre forming a large floral display.
Fruit:	Dull-red, strawberry-like fruit on older shrubs.
Bark:	Bumpy textured grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, elliptical and slightly curled.
Autumn Colour:	Orange-red to dark red.
Ultimate Height:	6m
Uses:	Grown for its bright white or pink bracts during early summer and good autumn colour. These are grown from seed so the bract colour varies.



Cornus kousa chinensis ‘China Girl’
Chinese Dogwood

Flowers:	Four pure white bracts with a dark centre forming a large floral display.
Fruit:	Red, strawberry-like fruit on older shrubs.
Bark:	Smooth.
Leaves:	Deciduous, elliptical and slightly curled.
Autumn Colour:	Reddish-orange.
Ultimate Height:	14m
Uses:	Large white bracts appear in early summer and good autumn colour.



Cornus kousa ‘Satomi’
Japanese Dogwood

Flowers:	Pink bracts around inconspicuous flowers.
Fruit:	Strawberry-like rosy-pink fruit.
Bark:	N/A
Leaves:	Deciduous, ovate leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Purple to deep red.
Ultimate Height:	4-8m
Uses:	For bright pink bracts in early summer as well as autumn colour.



Cornus mas
Cornelian Cherry

Flowers:	Late winter (February), masses of small yellow flowers.
Fruit:	Oval, cherry sized fruits containing a stone.
Bark:	Crackled and flaking giving great texture and colour.
Leaves:	Deciduous, elliptical, curl downwards.
Autumn Colour:	Pale yellow to orange.
Ultimate Height:	3m
Uses:	A small, robust tree grown for its winter flower interest and characterful shape.



Corylus avellana
Hazel

Flowers:	Yellow, male catkins in early spring.
Fruit:	Edible nuts.
Bark:	N/A
Leaves:	Deciduous and rounded with deep veins.
Autumn Colour:	Bright yellow.
Ultimate Height:	6m
Uses:	Native tree with a natural multi-stem shape. Beautiful spreading canopy and lots of nuts for wildlife.



Cotinus coggygria 'Royal Purple' Purple Leafed Smoke Tree

Flowers:	Large, feathery, pink inflorescences in summer.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	N/A
Leaves:	Deciduous, rounded and deep purple.
Autumn Colour:	Red-purple.
Ultimate Height:	3m
Uses:	Red leaf colour which can be used as colour contrast in a garden design.



Cotoneaster acutifolius Peking Cotoneaster

Flowers:	Small white corymbs.
Fruit:	Small red fruit turning black containing two nutlets.
Bark:	N/A
Leaves:	Deciduous, small, ovate, dull green leaves.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	2-3m
Uses:	A small shrub with attractive arching branches and the small flowers are absolutely loved by bees.



Crataegus coccinea
Scarlet Hawthorn

- Flowers:** Large, white, single flowers with pink stamens. Pungent smell.
- Fruit:** Medium sized bright red berries from late summer.
- Bark:** Light grey textured bark.
- Leaves:** Deciduous and broadly ovoid with serrated edges, medium green in colour.
- Autumn Colour:** Yellow-orange.
- Ultimate Height:** 6m
- Uses:** Small tree with a good shape and full of character. Great for attracting insects and birds with abundance flower and large red fruit. Fantastic autumn display.



Crataegus x lavalleyi 'Carrierei'
Hybrid Cockspur Thorn

- Flowers:** White flowers in late spring.
- Fruit:** Produces bright red haws, 2cm long, which stay on well into the winter.
- Bark:** Smooth, silvery grey.
- Leaves:** Deciduous, large glossy green, oval shape and finely serrated.
- Autumn Colour:** Bright red to orange.
- Ultimate Height:** 7m
- Uses:** A perfect tree for the smaller garden, or even larger gardens. Great spring blossom. Red haws in autumn and winter for the birds. Stunning autumn colour.



Crataegus monogyna
Common Hawthorn

Flowers:	Plentiful small white flowers, normally in May.
Fruit:	Roundish dark red berries.
Bark:	Light grey textured bark.
Leaves:	Deciduous and deeply cut, pale to dark green.
Autumn Colour:	Wine-red to yellow-orange.
Ultimate Height:	12m
Uses:	Ruggedly beautiful native tree with a natural multi-stem and great for insects and birds.



Crataegus persimilis 'Prunifolia'
Broadleaf Cockspur Thorn

Flowers:	Plentiful white umbels.
Fruit:	Numerous plump, orange-red berries.
Bark:	Textured, light grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, shiny dark green, broadly elliptical with finely serrated edges.
Autumn Colour:	Brilliant yellow-red to red.
Ultimate Height:	6m
Uses:	Very undemanding and is great as a specimen tree which rewards with a flower, fruit and autumn display. Great for attracting insects and birds.



Elaeagnus x ebbingei Ebbing's Silverberry

Flowers:	Creamy white, tube-shaped flower bells appear in Autumn.
Fruit:	Rounded red/silver fruit. Tasty when ripe.
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Evergreen, shiny green with silvery underneath giving two toned effect.
Autumn Colour:	Fruit and flowers appear in the Autumn.
Ultimate Height:	5m
Uses:	Perfect for coastal conditions as they tolerate salty air. We create beautiful umbrella shaped canopies for a statement in any garden design.



Elaeagnus multiflora Cherry Silver Berry

Flowers:	Small white flowers.
Fruit:	Edible dark red fruit.
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, pale green on top, silvery underneath, look like those of an olive tree.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow.
Ultimate Height:	3m
Uses:	Silvery leaf colour is great for contrast in design, plus fixes nitrogen in the soil.



Elaeagnus umbellata

Autumn Olive

Flowers:	Masses of tiny fragrant white flowers early summer.
Fruit:	Small, red edible fruit.
Bark:	Smooth, light grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, narrow and oval in shape. Silver underneath and green on top.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow.
Ultimate Height:	4m
Uses:	Small statement tree with great shape and colour contrast in the design with its silvery foliage. It fixes nitrogen in the soil as an extra bonus.



Euonymus alatus

Winged Spindle

Flowers:	Small, green-yellow flowers in spring with four petals.
Fruit:	Tiny bright red seeds.
Bark:	Conspicuous corky ridges or 'wings'.
Leaves:	Deciduous, small, ovate leaflets, light grey-green in colour.
Autumn Colour:	Bright scarlet.
Ultimate Height:	2m
Uses:	A shrub with unusual bark and bright red autumn colour.



Euonymus europaeus
Common Spindle

Flowers:	Small, yellow flowers in spring.
Fruit:	4-lobed red fruits which split to reveal orange seeds.
Bark:	Smooth grey bark with corky ridges or 'wings'.
Leaves:	Deciduous, narrow, ovate leaflets which are light green.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow to red.
Ultimate Height:	5m
Uses:	A great native tree for autumn colour on the leaves and seeds.



Fagus orientalis 'Iskander'
Fastigate Beech

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous and broadly elliptical, dark, glossy green.
Autumn Colour:	Deep coppery colour.
Ultimate Height:	8m
Uses:	As a columnar architectural shape within a garden design (not prone to aphids like Fagus 'Dawyck' types).



Ginkgo biloba
Maidenhair Tree

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, leathery, bright green, fan shaped.
Autumn Colour:	Buttery yellow.
Ultimate Height:	20m (very slow growing).
Uses:	Slow growing tree with unusual leaves and irregular shape.



Hamamelis x intermedia ‘Feuerzauber’
Fire Cracker Witch Hazel

Flowers:	Bright, coppery, orange flowers in winter with faint, sweet scent.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, rounded leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Orange and red.
Ultimate Height:	3.5m
Uses:	Very pretty shrub with a great winter flowering display.



Hamamelis x intermedia ‘Pallida’
Hybrid Witch Hazel ‘Pallida’

Flowers:	Yellow, orange and red twisted petals appear in winter on bare branches.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, large rounded leaves.
Autumn Colour:	Bright yellow.
Ultimate Height:	4m
Uses:	Attractive shrub with eye catching flowers in winter and beautiful autumn colour.



Heptacodium miconiodes
Seven-Sons Tree

Flowers:	Prolific clusters of small white flowers from late summer to late autumn.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Creamy beige that peels in long thin strips.
Leaves:	Deciduous, dark green and elliptical.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	5m
Uses:	Bark interest and fragrant flowers during September which attract bees for pollination.



Ilex crenata ‘Fastigiata’
Japanese Holly

Flowers:	Small white flowers.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Light grey.
Leaves:	Evergreen. Small, slightly glossy, triangular toothed leaves.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	4m
Uses:	Narrow and slow growing evergreen shrub similar to <i>Buxus</i> but resistant to disease.



Ilex ‘Nellie R. Stevens’
Holly

Flowers:	Inconspicuous, small white flowers.
Fruit:	Orange berries.
Bark:	Smooth, light grey.
Leaves:	Evergreen, thick and dark green leaves.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	4m
Uses:	Pretty evergreen shrub, good for winter interest like a Holly but not as spikey.



Juniperus communis ‘Hibernica’
Irish Juniper

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Dark brown peeling with age.
Leaves:	Evergreen, prickly green needles.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	4m
Uses:	Small, ornamental evergreen shrub that stays very slender.



Juniperus squamata ‘Meyeri’
Flaky Juniper

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Dark brown, peeling with age.
Leaves:	Evergreen, needle-like, pointed and prickly. Intense blue colour.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	1.5m
Uses:	Spreading evergreen shrub with intense blue colour.



Juniperus virginiana 'Burkii'
Red Cedar 'Burkii'

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Exfoliating, ridged brown bark.
Leaves:	Evergreen, needle-like, blue green.
Autumn Colour:	Purple flush.
Ultimate Height:	7m
Uses:	Attractive Juniper which is good for topiary.



Juniperus virginiana 'Hetzii'
Red Cedar

Flowers:	N/A
Fruit:	Juniper berries which smell like gin when crushed.
Bark:	Coppery coloured peeling bark.
Leaves:	Evergreen, prickly, scaly and grey-green in colour.
Autumn Colour:	N/A
Ultimate Height:	2.5m
Uses:	Small, evergreen tree with interesting bark and berries which can be added to a gin & tonic!



Koelreuteria paniculata
Golden Rain Tree

Flowers:	Small yellow flowers in conspicuous, large panicles.
Fruit:	Ornamental bladdery bronze fruits.
Bark:	Light grey with streaks of red.
Leaves:	Pinnate and pinkish in spring.
Autumn Colour:	Yellow.
Ultimate Height:	8-12m
Uses:	Medium sized tree with interesting leaves and great autumn colour.



Liriodendron tulipifera 'Fastigiatum'
Tulip Tree 'Fastigiatum'

Flowers:	Pale green flowers with orange at the base.
Fruit:	N/A
Bark:	Smooth grey.
Leaves:	Deciduous, typically lobed with the front lobe flat (as if it has been cut off).
Autumn Colour:	Bright yellow.
Ultimate Height:	12m
Uses:	A broad, conical tree for vertical interest.



Magnolia ‘Heaven Scent’
Magnolia

Flowers:	Flowers are rosy-pink petals fading to pale pink.
Fruit:	N/A
